- Everything is a pipe dream till there are repeat paying customers,
- 'Build it and they'll come' or 'Launch fast, fail and learn' applies if you have rich parents, wealthy relatives or have access to VCs who have made it big for themselves and are friendly to you. Otherwise, use the *Lean LaunchPad* methodology and invest time in getting the '*Job to be Done'* concept right.
- Doesn't really matter how experienced you were in the corporate machine, the *entrepreneurial transition* is a unique one.
